It's a hot Boston summer, and Nick Young, a washed-up journalist back in town to care for his dying father, is feeling the heat. Using his old skills to solve a mystery before the police do: to connect the dots between a major labor strike, a violent Occupy-style movement, and a murder that may involve his best friend's teen son.

Award-winning author Ron MacLean has delivered a blistering, moving literary thriller about fathers, sons, eco-terrorism, murder, immaturity, anarchism, marriage, friendship and failure.

In HEADLONG, Boston is in the throes of an ugly labor strike, pitting janitors against corporate leaders with everyone, including the mayor, taking sides. A wave of antiglobalist violence has hit town, with attacks against businesses, and demonstrations that call out the riot squad. Nick – a 42-year-old former journalist, once Boston's top

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investigative reporter – is reluctantly back from LA, on the rebound from a failed marriage, tending to his dying father.

When the home of a wealthy suburban family is robbed in broad daylight and the family's teenage son critically beaten, the police are suspiciously clueless. Nick pokes around out of professional habit and idle curiosity.

Robbery. Strike. Eco-terrorism. Somehow it's all connected, and somehow Nick is in the middle, as journalist, self-appointed social conscience, and friend to a teen who might or might not be implicated. Soon, his teen pal's girlfriend has disappeared, two janitors turn up dead in a dubious accident, and the various tensions in town start leading to the same roots: a high-profile business leader, a handful of politically fervent teens, a retired police chief, and the echoes of a crime left unsolved a generation before.
